Ability Awareness Week

This year our theme is "Invisible Disabilties." Our goal for this week is to teach students the importance of espousing empathy, understanding and patience for those classmates who experience challenges that are not readily apparent, but very real. Such challenges include learning differences, autism spectrum disorder, hearing impairment, social/emotional impairment, communication disorders, cognitive differences, and even allergies.

Irrespective of how children learn or navigate the world, one thing remains universal-- all children deserve to be included, whether in the classroom or out on the playground. By normalizing and even celebrating our students' differing abilities, as well as encouraging students to be more inclusive of their peers, we can create a more empathetic learning environment.

During the 2021-22 school year, there were 7.3 million students receiving special education or related services in U.S. public schools, making up 15% of total enrollment. It is our responsibility to raise awareness of differing abilities so that all students at Green Valley feel valued, irrespective of how they learn or operate in the world.

This week, students will engage in thoughtful conversations about invisible disabilities in their classrooms and our librarian will be sharing books that highlight characters with invisible challenges.

{read across America/pajama day will conclude our abilities awareness week with a recommended reading list that highlights learning about disabilities of all kinds}

We encourage you to talk with your children at home about the different types of invisible disabilities. The following definition can serve as a great conversation starter!

"In simple terms, an invisible disability is a physical, mental or neurological condition that is not visible from the outside, yet can limit or challenge a person's movements, senses, or activities. Unfortunately, the very fact that these symptoms are invisible can lead to misunderstandings, false perceptions, and judgments. People often judge others by what they see and conclude what a person can or cannot do by the way they look."

Our student committee for No Place for Hate will lead an icebreaker/conversation starter activity at lunch to teach their fellow students how to start a conversation with new people and be more inclusive.

This fun assembly is designed to get K-3 students thinking about the power they have to bring positive change on their campus and in the world as they live out the golden rule. We break down simple ways to practice this and help students understand empathy.

This assembly includes fun videos, impactful stories, and opportunities for student volunteers to practice kindness and inspire others to do the same.

4th & 5th Grade

Choices of An Everyday Hero

This powerful assembly is designed to encourage 4th & 5th graders to make courageous choices like those of everyday heroes.

Specifically, we talk about kindness and the courage to stand up for others – both in person and in the digital world. We address bullying using personal stories and encourage students to reach out for help. We help students learn healthy was of dealing with their feelings and above all to love themselves – not because of what they do, but because of who they are. We also have the option of covering choices they may be facing in the upcoming years such as drugs, alcohol and vaping. The assembly ends with students practicing positive encouragement.

Wednesday: Random Acts of kindness worksheet HW


